



## Best Lap 2020 Competition Regulations

### 1. Main clauses

- 1.1 Best Lap competition is a multi-stage enclosed territory championship. In year 2020 competition is held in 3 stages:
  - 1 stage – Tabasalu kart track – 13.06.20
  - 2 stage – Tabasalu kart track – 01.08.20
  - 3 stage – Audru Auto24ring – 12.09.20
- 1.2 Pre-registration form will be published on the official web page [www.bestlap.ee](http://www.bestlap.ee) at least 30 days prior to the event.
- 1.3 The Organizer of the competition is Hobby Racing MTÜ (80577392).

### 2. Participants division by classes

- 2.1 Participants of the serie are divided by followings classes:
  - 2.1.1 Street A – engine capacity up to 1600 cm3.
  - 2.1.2 Street B – engine capacity from 1601 to 2300 cm3.
  - 2.1.3 Street C – engine capacity from 2301 to 3000 cm3.
  - 2.1.4 Street D – engine capacity over 3001 cm3.
  - 2.1.5 Unlim 2000 – engine capacity up to 2000 cm3.
  - 2.1.6 Unlim 2000+ – engine capacity over 2001 cm3.
- 2.2 Engine capacity data is taken from the vehicle Technical Data Sheet. Organizers may refer to other sources to verify the information.
- 2.3 It is allowed by Organizers to round the engine capacity within 2%.
- 2.4 For the vehicles equipped with turbochargers, engine capacity (cm3) is multiplied by 1,7 coefficient. The same rule applies to rotary engines.
- 2.5 For participating in the classes of Street A, B, C and D only vehicles with street legal tires, with „E“ marking and Treadwear coefficient from 180 and above are allowed.
- 2.6 Participants who are using tires without „E“ marking and/or Treadwear coefficient 179 and lower are allowed to participate in the classes Unlim 2000 and Unlim 2000+.  
Competition tires are allowed (incl. semi-slicks and slicks).
- 2.7 The list of vehicle permitted changes for the calsses Street A, B, C and D are presented in the Best Lap Technical Regulations.

3. **All the controversial** issues concerning the determination of the vehicle class will be decided by the event Organizers. The decisions of the Organizers are non-disputable by Participants or third parties.

### 4. Definition of results

- 4.1 Time-counting is electronic. In cases when electronic time-counting is impossible, stopwatch will be used.
- 4.2 The goal of the Participant is to establish the fastest lap time of his class in each race.
- 4.3 The fastest Participant gets 1 point, the second 2 ponts and so on untill each Participant receives his point.
- 4.4 In total there will be 3 races carried out during the stage. The final result of the stage gives the sum of the two best attempts.
- 4.5 In case of same number of points in the same class, wins the Participant who showed the best lap time on the day of the competition during the time races. If the best lap times are equal, wins the one who has shown the second best time.  
At the end of the certain stage competition, Participants receive points in accordance with following chart table:



Place	1	2	3	4	5	6	7	8	9	10...

4.6 At the end of all stages the total points of all 4 stages will be calculated and the winner of the serie will be determined. Wins the Participant who gets the highest number of points in his class.

If 2 or more Participants in the same class have the same number of points, the winner will be determined by the numbers of the first places in different stages. In case of equal numbers of the first places, the winner will be determined by the number of the second places, etc. If that will not be enough, then the winner will be determined by the best place in the last, 4th stage or 3rd stage, etc. First three places in each stage will be awarded by the end of the stage. When less then 5 Participants are participating in class, onlt 1st place will be awarded.

4.7 At the end of the Best Lap 2020 event 3 first Participants in each class will be awarded.

## 5. Flags usage and their designation

### 5.1 Green flag – starting flag.

The race can be started only after the starting signal. Green flag is not used when traffic light is used.

### 5.2 Black and white checkered flag – finish flag.

Flag is used at the end of the race. After finish signal Participant should end the «cooling» lap and return to the pits by correct route.

### 5.3 Red flag.

Red flag is used when it is needed to stop the race due to the dangerous situation or other reasons. After the Red flag signal Participants should keep the speed level not higher then 50 km/h and be ready to break or change the direction. Follow the judges orders and return to the pit-line.

### 5.4 Yellow flag.

Yellow flag is used when the dangerous situation arises on the lap. Drivers must be careful.

### 5.5 Black flag.

Black flag is used to exclude the Participant from the race due to unsporting behaviour. Participant should return to the PIT and his results will not be counted.

## 6. Other information

6.1 Participants must have a valid driving licence.

Participants under the age of 18 are allowed to compete only with presence of responsible parent or legal guardian. Responsible parent or legal guardian should have valid driving licence and sit next to the Participant during all races.

6.2 It is allowed to use the same vehicle for two Participants, this information should be marked during the pre-registration. Each Participant should be registered separately.

6.3 If during the stage vehicle breaks down and Participant is not able to continue the race, he is not allowed to use another vehicle (or vehicle of other Participant) to continue the competition in his class. That rule applies only to the day of the stage. To continue participating in the competition in his calss Participant should repair the vehicle before the start of the next race.
